Surveillance Virtual Roundtable To Support "If You See Something, Say Something" Campaign

As part of the Department's national "If You See Something, Say Something" campaign to raise public awareness of potential indicators of terrorism, crime, and other threats, and emphasize the importance of reporting suspicious activity to law enforcement authorities, IP is hosting a virtual roundtable on surveillance detection awareness. The roundtable, entitled, "Surveillance Detection on the Job," is for employees working at critical infrastructure facilities, private-sector owners and operators, and State, local, territorial, and tribal governments.

This free, 90-minute online interactive session will be held on Sept. 9, 2010, at 2 p.m. (EDT) and will include video scenarios and expert commentary. The session will also address attendee questions and comments on how to recognize suspicious surveillance activities and behaviors, as well as the importance of reporting these activities in a timely manner.
